



ESOL COURSE DESCRIPTION

ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) Courses aim to:

- Respond to identified specific needs of the students and to assist them in their English language learning, and acquiring communication and academic competencies;
- Support students' intellectual, social and emotional growth. Development of a positive self-concept and a sense of belonging to the school and wider community is strengthened through their active engagement in a safe class learning environment and a variety of activities. Students have opportunities to learn to appreciate diverse beliefs from the diversity of cultures in ESOL classes as well as to nurture their own abilities and skills.
